Fed. Reg. 22250 (April 21, 2020)) (referred to in
this section as the "Navigable Waters Protection
Rule") is being implemented in all 50 States;
(2) the final rule issued by the Administrator of
the Environmental Protection Agency and the Sec-
retary of the Army, acting through the Assistant
Secretary of the Army for Civil Works, entitled
"Clean Water Rule: Definition of 'Waters of the
United States'" (80 Fed. Reg. 37054 (June 29,
2015))—
(A) was subject to a vote under chapter 8
of title 5, United States Code (commonly known
as the "Congressional Review Act"), in which
members of both parties in the House of Rep-
resentatives and the Senate voted in favor of
disapproving the final rule under that chapter;
and
(B) was stayed across the United States
for over 2 years due to legal deficiencies; and
(3) the Navigable Waters Protection Rule es-
tablished a definition of "navigable waters" under
