- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Direct Hire to Fight

18	didate to any position described in subsection (b) in the
19	Forest Service or the Department of the Interior, respec-
20	tively.
21	"(b) Positions.—A position described in this sub-
22	section is any Federal wildland firefighting position, or
23	any position in support of such a firefighting position, that
24	is described as follows:
25	"(1) Such a position within the Forestry Tech-
26	nician Series, GS-0462, or any successor series.

1	"(2) Such a position within the Aircraft Oper-
2	ation Series, GS-2181, or any successor series.
3	"(3) Such a position within the Miscellaneous
4	Administration and Program Series, GS-0301, or
5	any successor series, if the position supports fire-
6	fighting and is eligible for primary or secondary fire-
7	fighter retirement coverage.
8	"(4) Such a position within the General Nat-
9	ural Resources Management and Biological Sciences
10	Series, GS-0401, or any successor series, if the posi-
11	tion supports firefighting and is eligible for primary
12	or secondary firefighter retirement coverage.
13	"(5) Such a position within the Aviation Man-
14	agement Specialist Series, GS-2101, or any suc-
15	cessor series.
16	"(6) Such a position as an Engineering Equip-
17	ment Operator, WG, WL, or WS-5716, or any suc-
18	cessor series, if the position supports firefighting
19	and is eligible for primary or secondary firefighter
20	retirement coverage.
21	"(7) Such a position within the Dispatching Se-
22	ries, GS-2151, if the position supports firefighting
23	and is eligible for primary or secondary firefighter
24	retirement coverage.

1	"(8) Such a position as an Equipment Spe-

3	"(9) Such a position within any additional occu-
4	pational series developed specifically for wildland
5	firefighting.".

10	taries shall each submit to the relevant congressional
11	committees a report that contains the following in-
12	formation:
13	(A) The number of wildland firefighters
14	and wildland firefighting support personnel the
15	agency anticipates it will need for that calendar
16	year, delineated by position.
17	(B) The number of hiring events the agen-
18	cy is planning to hold that calendar year.
19	(C) The number of wildland firefighters
20	and wildland firefighting support personnel cur-
21	rently employed by the agency, delineated by
22	position.
23	(D) The number of wildland firefighter
24	and wildland firefighting support personnel va-
25	cancies by State.

1	(E) The implementation of the direct hir-
2	ing authority under section 9603 of title 5,
3	United States Code.
4	(F) The implementation of the streamlined
5	hiring policies developed under subsection (b).
6	(G) Recommendations to Congress to fur-
7	ther improve the recruitment and retention of
8	wildland firefighters and wildland firefighting
9	support personnel.
10	(2) Public availability.—The Secretaries
11	shall each annually publish the report submitted
12	under paragraph (1) on a publicly available website.
